Subject: Issuance of Temporary Emergency New Hampshire License

NH Medicaid Enrolled Providers located and licensed in another state must get a NH temporary emergency license if they plan on practicing in New Hampshire or offering telehealth to any resident in New Hampshire, per Emergency Order #15.

The NH Department of Health and Human Services has partnered with the NH Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) to streamline the temporary licensing process for NH Medicaid enrolled out-of-state providers. NH Medicaid will send OPLC lists of their enrolled providers practicing and licensed out of state. OPLC will issue temporary licenses to these providers and send the information to NH Medicaid, which will then forward the temporary licenses to the three Managed Care Organizations.

At this point, NH Medicaid plans to only send OPLC lists of providers located in states that border NH (MA, VT, ME). As of April 22, 2020, OPLC has issued temporary licenses for NH Medicaid enrolled physicians and nurse practitioners practicing and licensed in states that border New Hampshire. OPLC will also give temporary licenses to other medical professionals, including psychologists, clinical social workers, MLADCs and LADCs.
